




















What a busy and exciting term Wewak Street students have had. So exciting to see the growth and learning students are achieving over this term. Well done all.

Sexual extortion (sextortion) parent and student information

The Australian Federal Police (AFP), through the Australian Centre to Counter Child Exploitation (ACCCE) and state and territory police, are seeing a concerning global trend of teenagers being targeted online to send explicit images of themselves, and then being blackmailed once the images have been sent.

Victims, who are predominantly male teenagers, can suffer serious psychological impacts. Unfortunately, there have been instances of suicide and self-harm directly linked to victims of this crime.


