



Class 9 Highlights...








In Class 9 we learnt to sew hair scrunchies, we made beautiful art flowers and I made yummy jam drop cookies. Daltyn

In Class 9 I really enjoyed our beautiful art flowers and learning to sew. Pumping up the balls for Work Ed was good too. Liam











Representative Boccia Tournament 2025

The NSW School Sport Unit Representative Boccia Tournament is being held again in 2025. Students may trial for one of ten regional teams in August to gain selection for the state tournament in Sydney.

The tournament will be conducted in three divisions: Physical (ramper), Physical (thrower/ kicker) and Open. Students must have a **formal sporting classification** to trial.

The SSU Representative Boccia Tournament provides to an opportunity for talented players to represent their region and test themselves in a competitive environment.

Boccia Representative Tournament 2025

Students may trial for one of ten regional teams to compete at the state tournament in Sydney at the Quay Centre, Sydney Olympic Park on Wednesday 29 and Thursday 30 October 2025.

To be eligible, students must be turning 10 to 19 years of age in 2025 and have a **sporting classification** that is in one of the three following Impairment

Categories:

Physical – **Ramper** – limited to students with physical impairment/s preventing them from being able to throw a ball. These students require the use of a ramp to participate.

Physical – **Thrower/Kicker** – restricted to students with physical impairment/s affecting arm movement, causing limitations to their throwing ability (for example Cerebral Palsy).

Open – for the impairment categories: Intellectual (including autism), Vision, Deaf and Hard of Hearing, Transplant recipient and/or Physical not listed above.

Further information on sporting classification can be found here: https://app.education.nsw.gov.au/sport/disability-and-inclusion/CLASSIFICATION Please note: for students with physical impairment, a letter from a relevant medical specialist outlining the impairment and its impact on their sporting ability may be accepted, as not all physical impairments have access to a formal sporting classification.

Parents/carers can **register** their child online via DASH: https://diger.at/43dolmi **Cost -** \$15 to attend the regional trial, to be paid when registering. **Registrations close Friday 25 July 2025**.

Unlike our school competition, the expectation is that parents/carers register their child, then transport and manage their students throughout the trial / tournament.

Schools are not required to send staff to support students.
